

# LLYN BRENIG

## ANGLER'S MAP

Llyn Brenig opened for fishing on 27 April 1978. After the initial flush of easy fishing the reservoir settled down to provide top quality sport especially with prolific sedge hatches in the summer months. The 920 acre reservoir does lie at 377 m (1235 feet) above sea level and the spring time fishing can occasionally be interrupted by snow storms. Conversely, an absence of algae and cool water temperatures make this an ideal venue in July and August. Brenig is a regular venue for international competitions and has hosted a World Championship.

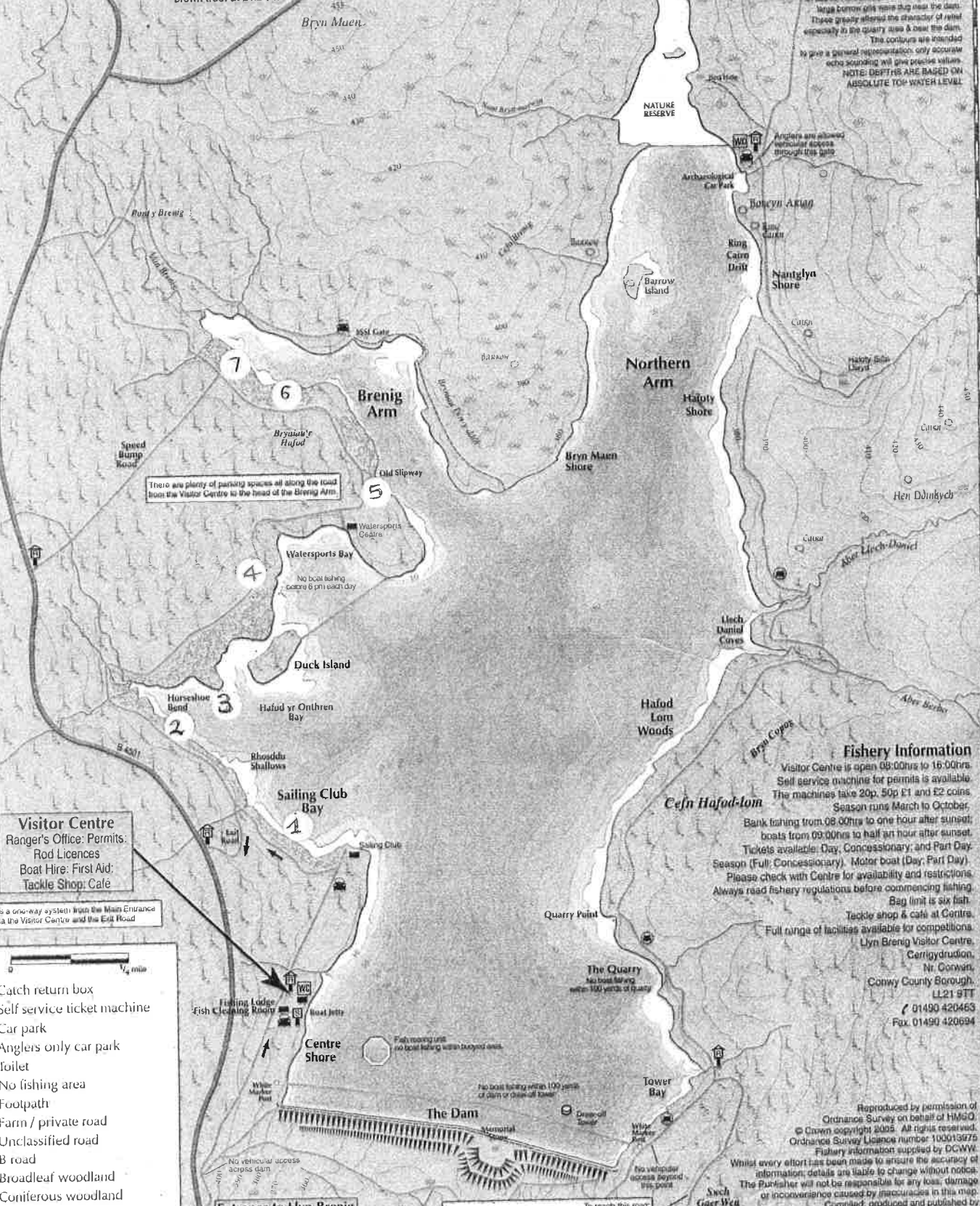
There are 46 boats (plus 2 wheelchair boats) available and 10 miles of bank fishing. Black buzzers are the staple diet early on, with sedges, septia curis, heather fly, green leaf weevils and daddy long legs all important later in the year.

The records for the water are:  
 rainbow trout 14lb 10oz and  
 brown trout at 21lb 7oz.
